

Competition Rules

1. All animals must be bona fide property of the competitors at the time of the competition, and for at least two months previous thereto, and must be grazed on the exhibitors grazing's during that period
2. No animal on the ground, unless penned, whether for show purposes or otherwise, can be left unattended during the day or fastened in any way except as may be approved of by the attendant members
3. The judges may withdraw or award premiums, where only one or more of each class is shown, as merit may appear to deserve. In these respects as well as everything else connected with the judging, the decision of the judge or judges shall be final
4. The committee reserves the right to reduce prize money in any competitions without notice, should it be found necessary
5. The stock stall shall be arranged to the directions given at the time, and all stock shall be on the ground by 10am on the day of the competition. No stock is to be removed from the show ground before 4pm, and stewards need to be attendance when stock is being removed
6. No one must enter the ring except the stewards and the judges
7. Competitors shall be themselves alone liable for any damage done by or to themselves, their servant, or stock, during the whole time they are on the show ground
8. Any objections must be lodged with the secretary in writing on the show day
9. Parties wishing to exhibit implements on the show ground should inform the secretary at least one week before the show
10. For the purposes of this show a crofter shall mean the tenant or owner/occupier of a holding as defined by current crofting legislation. All stock must be in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the show
